General Objectives

Students will gain a deeper level of understanding technological theory and practice as it applies to themselves, others, and society through the study of the course focus areas. By improving on the foundations created in previous modules, students will be able to take their technological expertise to a new level and enjoy a higher degree of independence in project work. Students will also gain foundational knowledge about Indigenous culture to build upon understanding of, and respect for, Indigenous Peoples in Canada. Possible areas of focus in Communication Technology this year include:

Career Exploration, Keyboarding Certificate, Programming Exploration

Students explore potential career choices in various fields of technology as related to course content, achieve a keyboarding certificate, and explore the world of programming at their own pace of learning.

Course COM 2035 - Raster Graphics 1 (1 Credit)

A raster format is commonly used in full colour images/graphics and photographs by using a data structure representing a generally rectangular grid of pixels or points of colour. In this course, students are introduced to the fundamental skills of raster graphics and their application

Course COM 1205 - Photography Introduction (1 Credit)

Students develop essential skills in camera use with a focus on basic composition. set-up and examination of exposure. The term photograph refers to either a physical or digital representation depending on equipment available to the student.

Course COM 2105 - AV Preproduction (1 Credit)

Students examine the value and need for audio/video/animation preproduction and explore strategies used to plan an audio/video project using a variety of technologies. Preproduction is stage one in the audio/video/animation process

Course COM 2115 - AV Production (1 Credit) Students expand on basic audio/video/animation production techniques with an emphasis on following a production plan. Production is stage two of the

audio/video/animation process

Course COM 2125 - AV Post-Production (1 Credit)

Students expand on basic audio/video/animation production techniques with an emphasis on following a plan, capturing/creating content to edit and ensuring that continuity is maintained. Postproduction is stage thee in the audio/video/animation process

Course COM 2145 - Animation 2 (1 Credit - by Student Choice)

Students explore the evolution of various animation styles and techniques (traditional and digital). Students apply planning, idea development and storytelling techniques to create an effective animation
